COUNCIL MEETING:

1) CALL TO ORDER, QUORUM IN ATTENDANCE

Mayor Bisso called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and noted that a quorum of City Council was in attendance Robertson attended via zoom.

2) INVOCATION, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Jalifi gave the invocation and Mayor Bisso led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3) Mayor/council/department head reports

Gerber – pleased to be here

Jalifi – Many people have spoken against changing the golf cart regulations

Green-Prats - Thanked staff

Parsch – Against golf cart changes and gave Beach Advisory Committee update

Mayor Bisso – gave an update regarding the groin project, the Stahlman Park repairs, the HGAC sewer grant and water quality; Chief – gave monthly PD report and introduced EMS staff; Chris gave the monthly EMS report.

ARTICLE IV – BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

DIVISION 1 -Generally

Membership on all city boards and commissions shall be accompanied by active participation in the activities of the commission or board and any member who is absent for three (3) consecutive regular meetings or activities of the commission or board or whose overall attendance at regular meetings for any twelve-month period falls below seventy-five (75) percent, shall automatically be dismissed from membership unless the chairman of the board writes a letter or appears before the city council and informs the council of the reason why the member should not be dismissed, and the council decides to permit the member to continue to serve. Vacancies occurring in the commission or board, for whatever reason, shall be filled within thirty (30) days by appointment by the city council for the remainder of the unexpired term. Members of the commission or board shall be considered at will appointees.

All meetings shall be open to the public and follow an agenda pursuant to the Open Meetings law, V.T.C.A., Government Code ch. 551, as now or hereafter amended. Records shall be maintained of all meetings and the commission will give an annual written report to the city council on the status of all activities and accomplishments.

Sec.	Definitions	
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The following words, terms and phrases when used in this division shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning: Board shall mean and include either an advisory board or a non-advisory board.

- (A) Advisory board shall mean and include a board, commission, committee, or task force established by the city, which is advisory in nature and treated as such, including the following:
- PLANNING COMMISSION
- HISTORICAL COMMISSION
- TOURISM AND BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION
- BEACH ADVISORY COMMISSION
- ANY OTHER COMMITTEE AS VOTED ON BY CITY COUNCIL
- (B) Non-advisory board shall mean and include a board, commission, committee, or task force established by the city, which has rulemaking or quasi-judicial power or whose decisions are typically "rubber stamped" by the city council, including the following:
 - Board of Adjustment and Appeals.
- (C) Member shall mean a person appointed to a board by the city council and shall include a person appointed as an alternate member.
- (D) A quorum shall consist of a majority of the persons serving as members of such committee and an affirmative vote of the majority of those present shall be necessary to pass upon pending

questions, the chairman being entitled to vote upon any question or matter before the committee.

Section _____ - Established

- (A) There shall be established and maintained commissions of the city consisting of five (5) members and 3 alternate positions, who shall serve without compensation. Those commissions shall be:
 - PLANNING COMMISSION
 - HISTORICAL COMMISSION
 - TOURISM AND BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION
 - BEACH ADVISORY COMMISSION
 - ANY OTHER COMMISSION AS VOTED ON BY CITY COUNCIL
- (B) LIAISON- a city councilman appointed by the city council will act as liaison to each of the commissions. The appointment and elections shall be made or held each voting cycle within thirty (30) days following the regular municipal election.
- (C) TERM The term of office of each such commission member shall be two (2) years with the option of possible re-appointment as determined by City Council.
- (D) ALTERNATE The alternates shall be appointed or elected at the same time and in the same manner as the voting member. Alternate members shall have no voting rights, unless the voting member is absent and shall attend meetings as requested.

Section ____ - Rules of Procedure

Rules of procedure. All boards shall adopt rules and procedures for the conduct of business and matters that may come before it. Such rules and procedures shall be substantially similar to the rules and procedures adopted by the city council and shall comply with the State of Texas and all applicable laws. Boards shall elect a chair and vice-chair from their membership for one-year terms commencing on January 1 based upon the board's appointment schedule.

Section _____ - Limitation on Authority

Unless otherwise specified in this Code or required by law, no board shall have the power to obligate the city in any manner whatsoever without the prior approval of the city council or city manager. Additionally, no board shall commit to the terms of any grant unless it has obtained the prior approval of the city council or city manager.

- Board of adjustment—Created.
- (a) Membership and composition; term; appointment of alternate members. A board of adjustment is hereby created which shall consist of the five members of city council. All cases to be heard by the board of adjustment will always be heard by a minimum of four members.

- (b) Proceedings.
- (1) The board of adjustment shall adopt rules necessary to the conduct of its affairs, and in keeping with the provisions of this chapter. Meetings shall be held at the call of the mayor and at such times as the board may determine. All meetings shall be open to the public.
- (2) The board of adjustment shall keep minutes of its proceedings, showing the vote of each member upon each question, or if absent or failing to vote, indicating such fact, and shall keep records of its examinations and other official actions, all of which shall be a public record and be promptly filed in the office of the city secretary.
- (c) Appeals. Any person aggrieved, or any official or department of the village affected by any decision or judgment of the building official concerning interpretation or administration of this chapter, may appeal such decision or judgment to the board of adjustment. Such appeals shall be taken within ten days, by filing with the building official and with the board of adjustment a notice of appeal accompanied by a fee as established by the city council specifying the grounds thereof. The building official shall forthwith transmit to the board all papers constituting the record upon which the action appealed from was taken.

State Law reference—Board of adjustment, V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.008 et seq.

- Same -- Powers and duties.
- (a) Generally. The board of adjustment has the following powers and duties:
- (1) Administrative review. To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is error in any order, requirement, decision or determination made by the building official in the enforcement of this chapter; and
- (2) Variance. To hear and decide on appeal such variance from the terms of this chapter as will not be contrary to the public interest, where, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of this chapter will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of this chapter shall be observed and substantial justice done.

Decisions of the board of adjustment.

- (1) May reverse, affirm or modify requirements. In exercising the above mentioned powers, the board of adjustment may, so long as such action is in conformity with the terms of this chapter, reverse or affirm, wholly or partly, or may modify the order, requirements, decision or determination appealed from and may make such order, requirements, decision, or determination as ought to be made, and to that end shall have powers of the building official from whom the appeal is taken.
- (2) Minimum vote needed for decision. The concurring vote of four members of the board of adjustment shall be necessary to reverse any order, requirement, decision or determination of the building official, or to decide in favor of the applicant on any matter upon which it is required to pass under this chapter, or to grant any variation in the application of this chapter.

Sec. 2-347. - Planning Commission: Powers and duties.

The commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) Perform those duties as required by any ordinance of the planning commission, the planning committee, or the advisory planning commission, in accordance with those ordinances.
- (2) Advise and make recommendations to the city council with respect to long range planning for the village.
- (3) Perform such other duties as may be assigned to the commission by the city council of the village.

ORDINANCE 2023.11.14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12, ARTICLE II, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF SURFSIDE BEACH, TEXAS, ADOPTING A LIGHTING ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; CREATING A PENALTY; AND FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE IS PASSED IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the Village of Surfside Beach, Texas, has determined that adoption of this Ordinance is necessary to the health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of said City and the members of the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this Ordinance was adopted at a meeting which was open to the public and preceded by proper notice, as required by Chapter 551 of the Texas Local Government Code (the Open Meetings Act).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF SURFSIDE BEACH, TEXAS:

FIRST, the findings and recitations set out in the Preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and they are hereby adopted by the City Council and made part hereof for all purposes.

SECOND, That Chapter 12, Article II, of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Surfside Beach, Texas, is hereby adopted to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. - RESIDENTIAL AND BUILDING CODE

Sec. 12-33 Outdoor Lighting.

(A) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:

Full Cutoff (FCO) describes a luminaire light distribution where 100 candelas per 1000 lamp lumens (10%) may emit at all vertical angles beginning at 80 degrees up from nadir to less than 90 degrees, and zero candela per 1000 lamp lumens (0%) is allowed at 90 degrees (horizontal plane) and all angles above. This applies to all horizontal angles around the luminaire. A full cutoff luminaire is also fully shielded.

Fully shielded fixture means that fixtures are shielded in such a manner that light rays emitted by the fixture, either directly from the lamp or indirectly from the fixture, are projected below a horizontal plane running through the lowest point on the fixture where light is emitted.

Illumination means an alternative term for illuminance. Commonly used in a qualitative or general sense to designate the act of illuminating or the state of being illuminated.

Lamp means the component of a luminaire that produces the actual light.

Light trespass means the shining of light produced by a luminaire beyond the boundaries of the property on which it is located.

Lumen means a unit of luminous flux. One foot-candle is one lumen per square foot. For the purposes of these regulations, the lumen-output values shall be the initial lumen output ratings of a lamp.

Luminaire means this is a complete lighting system and includes a lamp or lamps and a fixture.

Outdoor lighting means the nighttime illumination of an outside area or object by any man-made device located outdoors that produces light by any means.

- (B) Single-Family and Two-Family Lighting. Single-Family and Two-Family homes shall be designed so that:
 - (1) Fixture Type. Fixtures are shielded so that the light source is not visible from abutting properties, and so that the light cast on abutting properties does not exceed 0.1 foot-candles on the ground at the property line and on any window plane on the abutting property; and
 - (2) Operational Practices. Any motion sensor security lighting shall be pointed down and away from windows on abutting properties.
 - (3) Reduced Overnight Lighting. Residential and multifamily uses shall reduce outdoor lighting between the hours of 11:00 PM and sunrise by turning off any non-emergency lighting. Lighting reductions are not required for any of the following:
 - a. With the exception of landscape lighting, lighting for residential properties including multiple residential properties not having common areas;
 - b. When the outdoor lighting consists of only one luminaire;
 - c. Code required lighting for steps, stairs, walkways, and building entrances;
 - d. Motion activated lighting;
 - e. Lighting governed by approval of a Specific Use Permit in which times of operation are specifically identified; or
 - f. Businesses that operate on a 24-hour basis.
 - g. Low voltage landscape lighting, but such lighting shall be shielded or directed in such a way as to eliminate obtrusive light.
 - h. Low intensity "ambiance" lighting, such as "rope" lighting and frosted globe lighting.
 - i. Holiday lighting.

(C) Filing of complaint and penalty.

Any person may complain to the city in regard to lighting that does not comply with the standards set forth in this division. The complaint must

be filed in writing to the city code enforcement official. It shall be unlawful for the owner or tenant within the city to fail to comply with the standards set forth in this section within fifteen (15) days after notice is mailed or published, directing that such standards be met; the code compliance office or any other individual assigned such duties may, whenever a violation is found, file a complaint with the municipal court and/or issue citations. Fines shall be \$10 a day on the 16th day.

THIRD, This Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other Ordinances of the Village of Surfside Beach and this Ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other Ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any, in such other Ordinance or Ordinances are hereby repealed.

FOURTH, If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase, of this Ordinances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

FIFTH, All of the regulations provided in this Ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety, and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this Ordinance, acting for the Village of Surfside Beach in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

SIXTH, Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the Village of Surfside Beach in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this Ordinance or in the Code of the Village of Surfside Beach.

SEVENTH, This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and publication of its descriptive caption twice in the Brazosport Facts.

Waste Connections would like to sincerely thank you for the great opportunity we have had to serve the citizens and community of Surfside. We thoroughly enjoy and appreciate the relationship between Waste Connections and the City of Surfside.

Each year we evaluate the CPI-U and PADD 3 fuel prices, costs per our contract with the city. This year the CPI-U adjustment is 8.9% and the fuel adjustment is 5.64% for a total rate adjustment of 14.54%. I have enclosed further details of these adjustments with this letter.

We would like to adjust these rates on the November billing cycle.

The Village of Surfside Beach desires to designate this Agreement as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" of the Village of Surfside Beach for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The Village of Surfside Beach desires to designate the Village Mayor or designee as an authorized signer of the Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SURFSIDE BEACH:

- <u>Section 1.</u> That the Village of Surfside Beach enter into a Financing Agreement with Government Capital Corporation for the purpose of procuring City Vehicles.
- <u>Section 2.</u> That the Financing Agreement, by and between the Village of Surfside Beach and Government Capital Corporation is designated by the Village of Surfside Beach as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
