I would like to propose an amendment to Sec. 16-124. of the code of ordinances allowing the following exceptions to promote and sustain the ornithological significance and biodiversity of Surfside Beach Texas.

## Sec. 16-124. - Unlawful to allow accumulation or growth of weeds, rubbish, etc.

It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of any real property within the corporate limits of the village, to allow weeds, rubbish, brush or any other unsightly, objectionable or unsanitary matter to accumulate or grow thereon.

**Proposed Exceptions:** 

- 1. a nature area or wildlife habitat consisting of primarily native plants, posted as such with a permanent sign no larger than 8" by 10" inches.
- 2. 1/3 of a real property may be designated as a green area allocated to the support of birds and beneficial insects (i.e. hummingbirds, dragonflies, and native bees) through the growth of wildflowers and other wild plants
- 3. -----

#### **ORDINANCE 2025.12.09**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE II, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF SURFSIDE BEACH, TEXAS; EXEMPTING CHICKENS FROM THE LIST OF PROHIBITED ANIMALS; ESTABLISHING A CHICKEN POSSESSION PERMIT; SETTING A FEE FOR A PERMIT; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; CREATING A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; AND FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE IS PASSED IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the Village of Surfside Beach, Texas, has determined that adoption of this Ordinance is necessary to the health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of said City and the members of the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this Ordinance was adopted at a meeting which was open to the public and preceded by proper notice, as required by Chapter 551 of the Texas Local Government Code (the Open Meetings Act).

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF SURFSIDE BEACH, TEXAS:

FIRST, the findings and recitations set out in the Preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and they are hereby adopted by the City Council and made part hereof for all purposes.

**SECOND**, That Chapter 8, Article II, Section 8-22 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Surfside Beach, Texas, is hereby modified as follows:

#### Sec. 8-22. – Domestic farm and wild animals prohibited; variances.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to possess or keep, within the municipal limits of the village, any domestic farm animal, including, but not limited to, horses, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits, chickens, ducks, or geese.
- (b) It is unlawful for any person to possess or keep, within the municipal limits of the village, any wild animal, reptile, amphibian, or fowl, including, but not limited to, tigers, lions, bobcats, ocelots, wild cats, cougars, leopards, skunks, opossums, raccoons, panthers, bears, wolves, coyotes, foxes, monkeys, apes, elephants, rhinoceri, hippopotami, alligators, crocodiles, and all forms of poisonous reptiles.
- (c) The city council may, in its discretion, grant a variance to subsections (a) or (b) of this section, such variance to be subject to such limitations, conditions, and restrictions as are in the best interest of, and for the health, safety, and welfare, of the residents of the village and the animals in question.
- (d) It is an affirmative defense to the prosecution of subsection (a) of this section if the person is in possession of a horse on the public beach between the water's

edge and the vegetation line from September 16 through May 14, inclusive, each year, or any week day in the months of April, May, September and October of each year.

- (e) Possession of no more than three (3) egg laying hens is permitted within the municipal limits of the Village. To possess up to three (3) egg laying hens, the owner of the chickens must meet the following qualifications:
  - a. Purchase of an annual Village of Surfside Beach Chicken Permit. The Chicken Permit fee shall be set by the City Council and placed on the schedule of fees as currently established and kept on file in the office of the City Secretary.
  - b. The owner of the chickens must ensure the chicken coops that house their chickens meet the following qualifications:
    - i. Minimum of four (4) square feet of floor space per chicken;
    - ii. Heat lamps are prohibited at all times;
    - iii. Rodents must be prohibited from accessing the coop;
    - iv. Coops must be predator resistant; and
    - v. Coops must be at least twenty-five (25) feet from any dwelling unit.
  - c. A violation of this section shall be a Class C misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 per day, in addition to the revocation of the owner's Chicken Permit.

**THIRD**, This Ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other Ordinances of the Village of Surfside Beach and this Ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other Ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any, in such other Ordinance or Ordinances are hereby repealed.

**FOURTH**, If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase, of this Ordinances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

FIFTH, All of the regulations provided in this Ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety, and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this Ordinance, acting for the Village of Surfside Beach in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

**SIXTH**, Any violation of this Ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the Village of Surfside Beach in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this Ordinance or in the Code of the Village of Surfside Beach.
