- 1. Call the public hearing to order @ 6:30 PM

Mayor Davison asked about the size of the easement proposed. Mayor Davison asked if we were talking about a new easement or would this pipe run parallel with the existing. LNG Representative Shaw Ottis explained that this is a new request for easement and he was not knowledgeable about the older easement at all. Councilman Griffin had some technical questions about the pipeline and its contents. At this point an engineer for FLNG spoke about the pipeline location, depth and contents. He explained that the pipeline would be below ground. Peggy Llewelyn was recognized with a question as to if this new pipeline would have any impact on the wetlands and also would it cause any property here to become undevelopable. Mr. Ottis replied no, it would have no negative impact on the wetlands or surrounding land. Janna Williams asked exactly where the pipeline would be, Ottis was able to show the public a colored map indicating the locations affected. Peggy Llewelyn also asked if there would be any negative impact to the boat ramp, Ottis replied that there would not. Councilman Griffin asked if they would be laying the pipe deep enough, Ottis replied that the pipe would be the required five feet. After some further discussion a motion was made to close the public hearing.

Councilman Gaschler made a motion to approve the conditional use permit, second by Councilwomen Aust – Councilman Petty and Bisso were also in favor and Councilman Griffin was opposed.

## 7. CITIZENS'/VISITORS' COMMENTS TO COUNCIL

Georgia Pavey had some concerns about large trucks traveling on city streets other than Surf. Mayor Davison advised her that if she saw this to call and report it. Mayor explained that this may have been due to the road work. Mayor asked Chief to make sure we have adequate signage alerting trucks that Surf Drive is the road they are allowed to travel.

Brooks Porter asked about the CEPRA projects. Mayor Davison gave an update to say that funds were approved and that we have no cost share. We are waiting for the GLO to begin work.

Mike Janesch of the audience asked if the city had looked at the RESTORE funds, he works out with Dude Payne who had told him about this. Mayor Davison responded yes we have and that we had a speaker come to the BCCA meeting and inform others about

these funds. He also asked the Mayor if Surfside was looking at getting Freeport water and were we concerned about subsistence. Mayor said we were not at this time and likely would not in consideration of the amount of debt we have incurred to maintain and repair the system we have.

Georgia Pavey spoke about the community garden and had some things to present to the Council and public. Mayor Davison asked about potential dimensions and rules. Mrs. Pavey went into some of the ideas she had on structure for the community garden. She wanted to speak to Janna about potential grants. Mrs. Pavey also asked if Surfside would be getting any financial benefit to the pipeline like Quintana, Mayor responded that this is an agenda item. Mrs. Pavey asked if Surfside could annex territory like Freeport, Mayor responded that we cannot because we are a village and not a city.

### 8. MAYORAL/ALDERMEN/COMMITTEE/POLICE ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chief of Police, Gary Phillips, gave the update on the police activity for the month. He also announced that the EMS has purchased a heart monitor and is looking at a defibrillator.

Councilman Bisso asked about the traffic blocking beach access on Yucca, could we place a no parking signs there. Mayor Davison said that this can penalize homeowners if they have guests and that the police could monitor more. Councilman Bisso said that there was a meeting for an emergency management service coalition and that he would be glad to attend. Mayor Davison suggested that this sort of collation may not be cost effective.

Councilman Gaschler asked if there was a specific person that was supposed to clean the boat ramp because it is filthy, Mayor said public works was supposed to and he would mention this to Pete.

Councilwomen Aust asked Chief about the golf cart rules. Chief said that folks can call him if they need to before they make their purchase.

Mayor Davison announced that we have been managing the Seaweed as best as we can in consideration of the amount that is coming ashore and that we can only push it back for health or safety concerns.

Dortha Pekar announced that the historical committee had met and talked about Texas Navy Day on the 19 and  $20^{th}$  and that help and participation was appreciated.

Jennie Green announced that the planning committee had met and had a good meeting. They had approved two replats. They spoke about parking and recommend one parking spot rather than two. She said that the zoning ordinance needed to be updated in that it still said that the minimum lot size needed to be 22000 square feet. She also said that the noise ordinance seemed to be well written as it was and needed no changes.

Peggy Llewelyn announced that the beach advisory committee had met and spoke about the seaweed and the potential grants out there. She said that the walkovers were in need of repair and that there was a greater need for walkovers in lieu of the limited access at the main entrance due to the migrating soft sand.

Janna Williams announced that the tourism committee had met and that there was discussion of a kite flying contest. Janna asked about a community garage sale, Mayor Davison suggested that this is not really a city function and may be a better project for SOBA. He recognized Henry Pekar.
